## The Sunrise Questionnaire Response for AB 1388 Proposes That California Consumers are Being Harmed by Lack of Massage Services Resulting from Onerous Local Regulations.

## Just how Pervasive are Onerous Local Massage Ordinances?

The Associated Bodyworkers and Massage Professionals (ABMP) estimates that there are 25,000 massage practitioners in California. <sup>1</sup>

The Bureau for Private Postsecondary and Vocational Education (BPPVE) lists 204 schools under the keyword massage. <sup>2</sup>

Twenty-five thousand practitioners and 204 schools represent a very thriving collection of massage small businesses for a state supposedly seriously impacted by onerous local ordinances.

A random survey of local ordinances available online reveals a different story: 3

Over 72% of the local ordinances surveyed issue licenses to massage practitioners with 300 hours or less training. Less than 5% of cities license massage as adult entertainment, a category generally associated with more restrictive and onerous conditions.

More restrictive licensing is generally associated with particular local problems or attitudes that will likely persist with requirements designed for the state as a whole. Problems in massage regulation exist, but they are not pervasive. Local problems are best addressed locally.

There is no evidence that the state as a whole is negatively affected by onerous local regulations.

There is no evidence that massage consumers/clients within the state will be benefited rather than harmed by the effects of state intervention into massage regulation.

Please oppose AB 1388.
